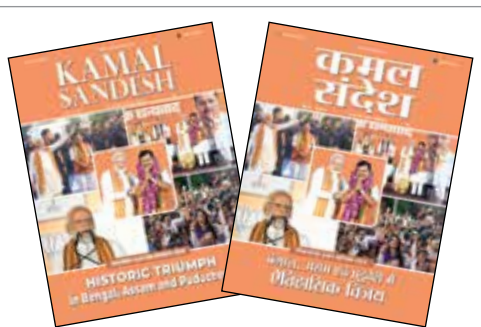

Five Cabinet Ministers Also Sworn In

In a historic and grand ceremony attended by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, BJP National President Shri Nitin Nabin, senior BJP & NDA leaders and lakhs of enthusiastic party Karyakartas, Shri Suwendu Adhikari took oath as the new Chief Minister of West Bengal at the iconic Brigade Parade Grounds in Kolkata on 09 May 2026. Shri Adhikari, who emerged as one of the most prominent faces of the BJP in Bengal, registered victories from both Bhabanipur and Nandigram constituencies in the recently concluded Assembly Elections, defeating Mamata Banerjee in the latter, is the the ninth Chief Minister of the State since independence. BJP government will accelerate Bengal's progress at an unprecedented pace: Amit Shah

Addressing the Legislature Party meeting of the Bharatiya Janata Party in Kolkata on 08 May 2026, Union Home and Cooperation Minister Shri Amit Shah described the BJP's historic victory in West Bengal as not merely an electoral triumph, but the beginning of a new era for the state. Speaking before the newly elected BJP legislators, Shri Shah said the overwhelming mandate reflected the aspirations of the people of Bengal for democracy, development, security, and freedom from decades of political violence and fear.

Shri Shah said seeing such a large number of BJP MLAs in Bengal fills every nationalist with immense joy and pride. He expressed heartfelt gratitude to the people of the state for placing their trust in Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and the BJP despite years of intimidation, violence, and suppression of democratic voices. According to him, Bengal had endured decades of ideological domination first under communist rule and later under the Trinamool Congress, where freedom of expression became increasingly difficult. Yet, the people displayed extraordinary courage and gave the BJP a resounding mandate.

The dream of "Sonar Bangla"

Invoking the timeless words of Rabindranath Tagore – "Where the mind is without fear and the head is held high" – Shri Shah said Bengal has now embarked on a historic journey toward realizing that vision. He remarked that the state, once celebrated for its intellectual, cultural, and spiritual leadership, had suffered years of economic decline, lawlessness, and political intimidation. The BJP government, he asserted, would now work tirelessly to restore Bengal's lost glory and fulfil the dream of "Sonar Bangla."

Victory historically significant

Calling the victory historically significant, Shri Shah said the BJP's ideological journey, which began under the leadership of Syama Prasad Mookerjee in 1950, had reached a defining milestone in 2026 with the formation of a BJP government in his home state. He recalled that

while the abrogation of Article 370 had fulfilled one long-cherished dream, the rise of the saffron flag in Bengal remained another emotional aspiration for BJP workers across the nation.

BJP's remarkable rise in Bengal

Shri Shah traced the BJP's remarkable rise in Bengal, from opening its account in a by-election in 2014, to winning 3 seats in 2016, 77 seats in 2021, and finally securing a massive mandate of 207 seats in 2026. He described this journey as inspiring yet deeply painful, remembering the sacrifice of 321 BJP karyakartas who lost their lives during years of political violence. He paid homage to these workers, saying their sacrifices strengthened both the party and national security.

Highlighting the strategic significance of the BJP's victory, he stated that with BJP governments now in Assam, Tripura, and Bengal, infiltration and cow smuggling would be effectively curbed. He asserted that Bengal would become a strong bastion of national security and development. Referring to the record voter turnout and peaceful conduct of elections, he congratulated the Election Commission, CAPFs, polling officials, and police personnel for ensuring violence-free polls in a state historically associated with electoral unrest.

Would end corruption

Shri Shah assured the people that the BJP government would end corruption, syndicate culture, hooliganism, and politicization of administration. He promised that women's security, civilian safety, industrial growth, modern agriculture, and infrastructure development would become top priorities. With BJP governments both at the Centre and in the state, he declared, Bengal's development could no longer be obstructed. Shri Shah said the BJP government would strive to restore Bengal's leadership in art, culture, literature, education, and economic progress, making true once again the famous words of Gopal Krishna Gokhale: "What Bengal thinks today, India thinks tomorrow." ■

- Earlier, he was elected from Kanthi Dakshin in 2005 and served as Member of Parliament from Tamluk in 2009 and 2014.
- In the 2021 West Bengal Assembly elections, Shri Adhikari defeated the then Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee from the Nandigram Assembly constituency in a closely watched contest.
- He also served as the Leader of the Opposition in the West Bengal Legislative Assembly from 2021 to 2026.
- Following the 2021 Assembly elections, large-scale political violence was reported across several parts of West Bengal, during which many BJP workers and supporters were targeted. During this period, Shri Adhikari emerged as one of the principal opposition voices raising concerns over the incidents of post-poll violence.
- Shri Adhikari was also a prominent opposition voice during the unrest and atrocities in Sandeshkhali and became one of the leading faces of the BJP's campaign on the issue.
- On 8 May 2026, he was unanimously elected as the leader of the Bharatiya Janata Party Legislative Party in West Bengal.
- Shri Adhikari took oath as the Chief Minister of West Bengal on 9 May 2026 at Brigade Parade Ground in Kolkata, becoming the first BJP Chief Minister and the ninth Chief Minister of the state. ■

A HISTORIC ADVANCEMENT IN INDIA-NETHERLANDS RELATIONS

CHOLA-ERA COPPER PLATES FINALLY RETURNED HOME

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi formally received the historic 11th-century Chola dynasty copper plates, known as the "Leiden Plates," during his official visit



on 16 May to the Netherlands. The sacred copper inscriptions were handed over by Leiden University, marking a major diplomatic and cultural milestone in India's ongoing efforts to reclaim its lost heritage from abroad. In a post on X PM said "A joyous moment for every Indian! Chola Copper Plates dating back to the 11th Century will be repatriated to India from the Netherlands. Took part in the ceremony for the same in the presence of Prime Minister Rob Jetten."

"The Chola Copper Plates are a set of 21 large plates and 3 small plates and largely contain texts in Tamil, one of the most beautiful languages of the world. They relate to the great Rajendra Chola I formalising an oral commitment made by his father, King Rajaraja I. They also showcase the greatness of the Cholas. We in India are immensely proud of the Cholas, their culture and their maritime prowess," the PM added. He also thanked the Government of the Netherlands and Leiden University in particular, where the Copper Plates were kept since the mid-19th century.

**PM'S VISIT TO NORWAY
VISIT OPENS NEW AVENUES FOR
COOPERATION IN GREEN TECHNOLOGY
AND GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT**

PM Modi participated in 3rd India–Nordic SUMMIT

The summit reinforced India's growing engagement with the Nordic region and created new opportunities for strategic cooperation in technology, sustainability, and innovation. ■

ADVANCING A SPECIAL Strategic Partnership

Cooperation in emerging technologies and connectivity also received major attention. Agreements were signed in critical minerals, scientific research, maritime transport, education, and innovation. India has emerged as one of the world's fastest-growing major economies while pursuing one of the world's largest renewable energy transitions. The approach is guided by a clear objective: To bridge climate ambition with development realities.

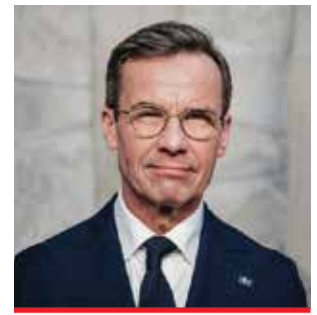

other global platforms that India has formed with the United Nations and international partners — including the International Solar Alliance, the Global Biofuels Alliance and Mission LiFE, India is a responsible voice of the Global South.

Simultaneously, Sweden leads the way in European climate action. Thanks to bold decisions taken decades ago, the electric grid is 98 per cent fossil-free. The contribution of the private sector in innovation and exports of climate-friendly solutions cannot be overstated. All in all, emissions have decreased by more than a third since 1990 — and during this time, the size of Sweden's economy has almost doubled.

The approaches of India and Sweden reflect a broader belief that climate action can create jobs, expand opportunity, strengthen energy security and improve lives. The aim is not only to decarbonise domestic development pathways, but to help build partnerships that make clean industrialisation at scale possible.

It is in this spirit that India and Sweden met in Gothenburg on May 17. Our partnership reflects a shared conviction that industrial transformation can be driven through collaboration between governments, industry, innovators and financial institutions.

The green transition is not only an environmental imperative, it is also central to competitiveness, economic resilience and long-term growth.

India and Sweden have demonstrated the value of such cooperation through the LeadIT, launched jointly by both countries in 2019 with the support of the United Nations. LeadIT has helped place industrial decarbonisation and hard-to-abate sectors at the centre

of the global climate discussion. More importantly, it has shown that developed and developing economies can co-create solutions through trust, innovation and shared responsibility.

Today, however, the scale and urgency of the challenge demand that we move further and faster.

The next phase of LeadIT should move from words to action, meaning implementation at scale. It has proved to be a useful platform for action by accelerating technology partnerships, enabling industrial pilot projects, mobilizing sustainable finance, strengthening resilient clean-energy supply chains and building globally competitive low-carbon industries.

The next phase should aim to support workforce transitions, skills development and financial architecture that reduce risk and lower the cost of capital for industrial transformation.

Not every country needs to invent every solution, but every country should have the opportunity to adapt, deploy and scale technologies suited to its developmental circumstances and priorities. Emissions do not recognise borders, and neither can the solutions.

We, therefore, call for a broadening and

deepening of this coalition through 2030. We invite more countries, including Nordic partners with strong innovation ecosystems and clean technology leadership, to join and actively contribute to this effort. The industrial transition can succeed only if it can deliver tangible economic value and social progress.

Solar, wind, hydropower, nuclear energy, storage technologies and low-carbon industrial solutions will all have important roles to play depending on national circumstances and priorities.

No country can secure every critical technology, mineral or industrial input alone. Nor can any nation address climate change in isolation. Emissions do not recognise borders – which is why solutions must be international.

The opportunity before us extends far beyond climate policy. It is about shaping a new era of industrial cooperation.

India and Sweden remain committed. At a moment of global uncertainty, our message is clear: Cooperation, rather than fragmentation, will define the pathway to shared prosperity and a sustainable future. ■

FORMER UTTARAKHAND CM BC KHANDURI PASSES AWAY

Former Uttarakhand Chief Minister and veteran BJP leader Shri B. C. Khanduri passed away in Dehradun on 19 May 2026 at the age of 91. His death marked the end of an era in Uttarakhand politics, where he was widely respected for his integrity, discipline and commitment to development.

Born on 1 October 1934 in Dehradun, Bhuvan Chandra Khanduri began his career in the Indian Army and rose to the rank of Major General before entering politics. He represented the Garhwal constituency multiple times in the Lok Sabha and also served as Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways in the Vajpayee government. In 2007, Khanduri became the first elected BJP Chief Minister of Uttarakhand after the party secured victory in the Assembly elections. He later served a second term as Chief Minister from 2011 to 2012.

Leaders across the political parties expressed their condolence on his demise. Hon'ble President Smt.

Draupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi also expressed grief and remembered his contribution to the nation and public life.

Building on India's vision of MANAV-putting human at the centre of technology and Italy's leadership in promoting a human-centric 'algor-ethics' rooted in its humanist tradition, our partnership seeks to ensure that AI acts as a catalyst for social empowerment. Our approach combines India's digital scale with Italy's ethical and industrial expertise, ensuring technology serves human dignity. By sharing best practices in secure digital cooperation, capacity-building and resilient cyber infrastructure, we aim to create an open, trustworthy and equitable digital space in which every nation can shape and benefit from AI. This perspective forms the core of Italy's G7 Presidency and outcomes of the AI Impact Summit 2026, held in New Delhi. Conceiving AI as a tool created by humans for humans means firmly asserting that technology cannot replace individuals or undermine their fundamental rights, nor be used to manipulate public debate or alter democratic processes. Our approach to defending freedom and human dignity in an increasingly interconnected world hinges on this very challenge.

energy to hydrogen technologies, and from smart grids to resilient infrastructure. While India's push for becoming a hub for green hydrogen exports offers immense potential, it perfectly complements Italy's advanced technology in renewable infrastructure and its strategic role as an energy gateway for Europe. Our collaboration along with other countries in key India-led initiatives - International Solar Alliance (ISA), Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI) and Global Biofuels Alliance (GBA) - is also important in this context.

Both India and Italy are located at the very heart of two crucial hubs of the global economy, the Indo-Pacific and the Mediterranean-regions that cannot be viewed as separate spheres, but instead as increasingly interconnected spaces.

THE WORLD'S MOST POPULAR POLITICIAN

Western leaders have much to learn from Narendra Modi's consistent focus on the environment

On Monday 18 May, the world's most popular politician will visit Norway. India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be received by King Harald, promote Indian business, meet with the Indian diaspora and attend an India-Nordic prime ministers' meeting. The Nordic prime ministers should listen carefully. They have a lot to learn from their Indian counterpart.

Whilst Nordic prime ministers barely enjoy a domestic approval rating of 30 per cent, Modi stands at around 70 per cent in the polls. No leader in any major country is nearly as popular at home as Modi.

Modi has been in power in India for more than twelve years. Should he choose to stand again, all the signs suggest he will be re-elected. A distant dream for European leaders. His success can be attributed to rapid economic development, a winning ideology, the world's strongest political party and his own life story.

Modi's background is almost unique in a world where almost all heads of state come from the upper middle class. Modi's parents owned three stalls where they sold tea at the railway station in Vadnagar, a tiny provincial town that hardly any Indians have heard of. He has no one to thank for his career but himself – and the Hindu nationalist movement. He is an Indian Einar Gerhardsen – self-taught, an organiser.

Einar was Norway's former prime minister.

He is fortunate to be leading a rapidly developing India, and he himself is a strong driving force behind that growth. The Indian economy is currently growing at seven per cent, faster than China's and far outpacing any other major economy. Growth is uneven, and there is a wide gap between the richest and poorest states in India. India lacks the highly educated workforce that China has. There is still too much bureaucracy, and India has not managed to develop any major export industry for the global market. But at current growth rates, India's economy will quadruple by 2050. India will then be the world's second-largest economy, rivalling the US.

I have travelled to almost every state in India and see signs of development everywhere – new, modern airports; better roads leading to the most remote corners of the country; the world's largest solar park under construction in Gujarat; and the world's largest solar-wind-hydro power plant in Andhra Pradesh.

Modi is the guarantor of green growth. India is now the world's third-largest producer of solar and wind energy; no one should be surprised if they overtake the US and take second place. Last year, coal emissions in India fell for the first time.

Western leaders can learn a great deal from Modi's consistent green message. I attend many conferences where Modi is the keynote speaker. Modi almost never talks about global climate negotiations or emissions. He asks no one to make sacrifices for the environment. The message is that India can lift 1.5 billion people out of poverty through green growth. There is no longer a choice between the economy and the environment.

Even if secular parties were to win the next election, India's ideology will remain Hindu nationalism. Hindu nationalism is India's answer to the question that all non-Western countries have faced since the Industrial Revolution. How to modernise without becoming like the West? Japan was the first to untangle that knot – becoming ultra-modern, yet remaining deeply Japanese. Korea is now richer than Japan and a major exporter of Korean culture and

NARENDRA MODI KEEPS RUNNING CIRCLES AROUND HIS CRITICS

For years, Western liberals and India's opposition have both consoled themselves with a theory: Prime Minister Narendra Modi is an authoritarian, India's overwhelming diversity is ultimately incompatible with strongman rule and thus his illiberalism will naturally backfire.

That theory met perhaps its largest setback yet on Monday, when Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party — the largest political party in history

— captured one of the states that should have been most impossible for it to appeal to: a fiercely independent, culturally distinct region home to more people than California, Texas and New York combined. The opposition would do well to try to learn from its latest loss.

Monday's vote did more than flip a state. For decades, India's most powerful regional parties have been the most resilient limit on the BJP's national expansion — locally rooted political machines, fluent in their states' language and identity, that the BJP's predominantly northern, Hindi-speaking culture often struggled to penetrate. West Bengal's Trinamool Congress, led by the formidable Mamata Banerjee, was among the most prominent of them, lending credibility to the idea that India's pluralism is simply too expansive for any one party to knit together — much less one pushing for a specific, muscular vision of cultural nationalism. In routing Banerjee on Monday, the BJP demonstrated it can now break the regional and cultural barriers that were supposed to

contain it.

Even before this win, the numbers behind the BJP's ascent were already staggering. The BJP boasts 140 million members, more than any political party on Earth, exceeding the Chinese Communist Party — its only peer — by 40 percent. More votes have been cast for Modi than for any politician in human history, by a margin in the hundreds of millions. Modi has comfortably outperformed every other democratically elected leader in the world in Morning Consult's global leader approval tracker for many years, despite the longevity of his tenure. By the metrics that translate to power in a democracy, the Hindu right is already the contemporary world's most successful political movement.

Critics counter — not without reason — that electoral successes are not the only way to measure democratic strength, and that the BJP and the broader Hindu nationalist movement have eroded India's liberal institutions, press freedoms and pluralist social fabric, with minorities facing rising violence and discrimination under its rule.

They further claim the ballots are not all that they appear, and accuse the BJP of tilting the playing field — stacking the election commission and engineering a now-defunct donation scheme that gave the party steep financial advantages over its rivals. The West Bengal vote drew its own controversy after the election commission purged about 9 million names, roughly 12 percent of the electorate, from the voting rolls — a move supporters defended as removing duplicate, ineligible or deceased voters, and that critics decried as a weapon to disenfranchise the Muslim minority that votes predominantly for the opposition.

But electoral engineering alone cannot account for the BJP's successes. The party took more than two-thirds of West Bengal's seats on Monday, and in less than 50 years has gone from a fringe outfit to leading 21 states — while the Indian National Congress, the party that led India to independence, has been reduced to four holdouts.

The contrast with its principal rival is instructive. The Congress party inherited its dominance: It spearheaded the independence movement, won the buy-in of India's English-speaking elite and built the institutions of the state it would govern for most of the country's first half-century, animated by fashionable international ideas about how to manage society. The BJP built its dominance the hard way – from the ground up through decades of grassroots organizing, painstakingly melding together a coalition that now spans castes, languages, regions and religious traditions that have otherwise had little reason to vote together.

Its foundation is the Sangh Parivar or “organization family,” of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), a Hindu nationalist volunteer organization, now a century old, focused on cultivating millions of cadres and dozens of organizations devoted to reviving its vision of Hindu society. In concert with the BJP, the RSS spreads its message through a network of other organizations it founded alongside the BJP: India's largest labor union, largest private school network,

largest student union and the most influential council of Hindu religious leadership, to name but a few. That unique set of on-the-ground, ideological and social ties across Indian society, combined with hard-nosed dealmaking and shrewd alliance building, has been the foundation of the BJP's extraordinary rise.

The BJP is consolidating power just as India takes its place among the world's great powers: largest by population, second-largest by military personnel, on the way to becoming third-largest by economy, and the only nation with the potential to counterbalance China in Asia. Monday's victory in West Bengal shows that the BJP's rise has not yet reached its ceiling.

The BJP's opponents may keep waiting for the reckoning they've long predicted. It may yet arrive. But anyone watching the evidence should instead prepare for the India of the coming decades – and the balance of power in Asia – to be built in no small part by the Hindu right. ■

music. China anchors its modernity in its own roots – in Confucianism, Taoism and Buddhism.

The BJP is currently the world's largest political party, with over 100 million members. The party has dedicated activists in every single constituency across northern and central India. The party has achieved something truly unique and unprecedented in India: the BJP enjoys the same level of support amongst high-caste, low-caste and untouchable communities. It has the support of both India's billionaires and tribal peoples in the country's remotest corners.

Among Western analysts, it has become something of a pastime to find fault with the BJP. The critics are right in saying that the BJP stands for the unification of Hindus. But there is little evidence to suggest that there have been more conflicts between Muslims and Hindus under the BJP. There was more violence and more pogroms when the Congress Party was in power. Millions of Muslims are crossing into India from neighbouring countries; hardly any Muslims are fleeing the other way.

But the BJP's insistence that Islam and Christianity are foreign religions, and that Muslim invasions in the Middle Ages and British colonialism can be equated,

creates a sense of insecurity among many Muslims. Many of the BJP's proposals are common sense – such as the idea that there should not be a separate marriage law under which Muslim men can divorce more easily than other men. But in the emergence of a new, strong India rooted in Hindu dharma, the real test will be whether the BJP can also find room to include the world's largest minority: the two hundred million Muslims in India.

India is the only large, poor former British colony to have chosen a democratic model. This is not down to the British. If it were to their credit, as they often claim, surely Pakistan, Myanmar and the Gulf monarchies would also be democracies? India is democratic because democracy is deeply rooted in Indian culture and tradition.

In a world where Norway needs new allies for a rules-based international order and Norwegian business needs new horizons, we have much to gain from closer ties with India. But this requires us to be willing to listen, not just to lecture. Then countless win-win opportunities could open up. ■

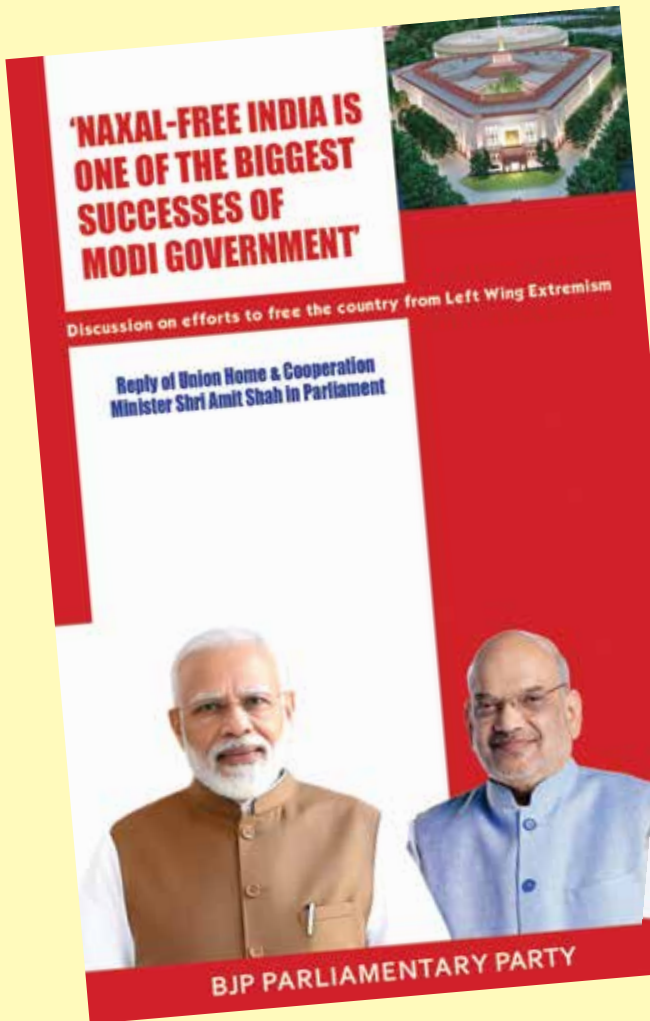
